Sculpture Trail returns to RHS Garden Hyde Hall

After a very successful first year, the Surrey Sculpture Society (SSS) has been invited back to the RHS Garden Hyde Hall at Chelmsford, Essex, to present their second annual Sculpture Trail from June 24th until 30th July, within one of the finest gardens in the East of England.

As one of the most renowned regional arts organisations in the country, the Society has over 250 members from across the South East of England, including Essex, Norfolk and Kent.

SSS Exhibition Manager Angie Doy commented on the success of the 2016 event: 'Last year visitors were surprised and delighted to find our members' work there. Many were locals who returned again and again with friends and family. Others came from around the South East, visiting many gardens along the way. Hyde Hall gardens are enormous and beautiful with stunning views. Our sculptors loved the new venue and we are all looking forward to returning this summer.'

The Society will be exhibiting the works of their talented emerging and professional sculptors, who create affordable and original pieces that can form eye-catching focal points in gardens, conservatories and interiors. Their many sculptures will be thoughtfully placed throughout the 360 acre gardens including in the hilltop, dry and woodland gardens and will give visitors the opportunity to see how sculpture can enhance any garden. This year there will be an additional indoor exhibition for smaller sculptures.

A trail guide will be given to visitors to lead them through each area of the gardens, where they will discover sculptures made in a diverse range of materials including bronze, resin, glass, metal, wood, stone, ceramic and found objects, with all sculptures for sale during the event.

Henriette Van der Does, Chair of the Surrey Sculpture Society commented: 'The Surrey Sculpture Society is delighted and proud to return to RHS Hyde Hall for a second year, building on the success from last year. This wonderful Garden forms the perfect setting for all sculptures, created in a large variety of materials by our artists who work in many different styles. One of the many benefits of membership of SSS is the opportunity to show our work in such prestigious locations and new members are always welcome.'

Hyde Hall's Head of Site, Ian Le Gros added "The sculpture exhibition was a very welcome addition to our summer schedule last year and feedback from visitors was exceptional. The garden provides the perfect backdrop for sculptures, with some pieces acting as focal points and others nestled amongst trees and flowers awaiting discovery. Needless to say, I'm thrilled to welcome them back this year "

RHS Garden Hyde Hall is the second RHS Garden to host a Surrey Sculpture Society exhibition. The Society will have their nineteenth annual sculpture trail at RHS Garden Wisley later in the summer.
