Surrey Sculptors invited by the National Trust's Hatchlands Park to stage summer arts event

The National Trust's Hatchlands Park has invited the Surrey Sculpture Society (SSS) to stage a major arts event this summer to include a sculpture trail, indoor arts exhibition and demonstrations by sculptors as part of the Society's 25th Anniversary celebrations.

165 sculptures will be on display from **18th June - 14th July**, as part of a Sculpture Trail featuring over 90 sculptures, that will lead visitors through the formal gardens and sweeping lawns, through an area of ancient trees and wildflower meadows. A further 75 sculptures and 2D artwork will form an exhibition in a marquee within the grounds.

Visitors will be able to enjoy the beauty of this renowned and historic National Trust property and the artwork on Tuesdays, Wednesday, Thursdays and Sundays from 10 am - 5pm.

Henriette van der Does, Chair of the Surrey Sculpture Society commented: 'The Surrey Sculpture Society (SSS) is honoured to have been invited by the National Trust's Hatchlands Park to create a new summer attraction in the form of a Sculpture Trail and Indoor Exhibition. The Park has a great variety of natural features making it an ideal setting for a varied show of around 90 outdoor pieces and the indoor art exhibition in a marquee will have another 75 or so pieces; and on some days free demonstrations will be organised for visitors.

'SSS is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year and the Hatchlands Park event promises to be extra special since four of our original 14 founder members will be exhibiting with us once again. The aims and visions of the founders are still very much our mission today: the SSS offers exhibition opportunities for all of our members; we educate the public and our own members in the arts through workshops, demonstrations, publications and lectures. The SSS Founder Members who will be exhibiting at Hatchlands include:

- Jeanne Argent, whose ceramic sculptures are inspired by the natural world.
- Patrick Daw who uses a range of materials including wood, plastics and resin, machine or hand- shaped from drawn images to create a diverse range of sculptures.
- Colin Arthur. Guildford born, Colin draws his inspiration and skills from his background in film special effects.

- Bob Belderson is SSS Member No2 and is inspired by sculptor Henry Moore, Rodin and Gustav Klimt's style as a painter, to create his resin and bronze sculptures.

The SSS exhibition manager for the event will be equestrian sculptor, artist and print maker Sarah Scott.

Visitors to the event will discover affordable and original sculpture made from a diverse range of materials including bronze, resin, glass, metal, wood, stone, ceramic and found objects that can form eye-catching focal points in gardens, conservatories and interiors, with all sculptures for sale during the event.

'We are delighted to be joining with Surrey Sculpture Society to celebrate their 25th anniversary, and look forward to displaying an array of sculptures at Hatchlands Park this summer. Each sculpture will be situated carefully in the historic landscape, and we hope that visitors will delight in the unexpected as they explore the gardens on a trail of discovery'. HATCHLANDS PARK

As one of the largest country estates in Surrey the grounds offer seasonal colour, way marked walks, tranquil quiet areas and a natural adventure area for children. The Gardens at Hatchlands Park were partly landscaped by Humphry Repton, the last great English landscape designer of the eighteenth century, often regarded as the successor to Capability Brown; he also sowed the seeds of the more intricate and eclectic styles of the 19th century. Hatchlands Park also has a Kitchen Cafe and newly refurbished Coach House Cafe in the cobbled courtyard, plus a shop and garden plants.
