RENOWNED SCULPTOR HAZEL REEVES TO DELIVER SURREY SCULPTURE SOCIETY'S AUTUMN LECTURE BY ZOOM

As a cutting edge professional artists' organisation the Surrey Sculpture Society has had to adapt quickly to the current and ever changing circumstances by embracing technology. The Society will be using Zoom to present its first Lecture Event for 2020 by renowned sculptor Hazel Reeves, on **Tuesday**, **6th October at 7pm - 8.30pm**.

Hazel's sculpture has been featured on TV over the last five years – on the news, in documentaries and on 'Have I got News for You' and 'University Challenge'.

Hazel Reeves commented:

"I'm a figurative sculptor, working to commission in clay for bronze, with a curiosity in people, their faces and their stories. My passion is for telling stories in bronze of struggles for social justice and redressing the lack of diversity in statuary, particularly the lack of women represented. I want to engage and move people – moving them to tears, to ask questions, to participate, to tell their own stories."

Hazel is best known for her bronze public commissions including her sculpture of Sir Nigel Gresley at King's Cross Station, the eminent railway engineer and designer of The Flying Scotsman. Her 'Rise up, Women' Her 'Rise up, sculpture of Emmeline Pankhurst captures the spirit of this great women's rights pioneer and was unveiled in St Peter's Square, Manchester in December 2018.

Further public commissions have included the moving bronze of a young and brave girl Sadako Sasaki for the Held Wen Peace Garden on the World Day of Peace in 2012.

Hazel also creates portrait commissions and has a great appreciation of dance, capturing and choreographing stories in bronze and is a Member of the Royal Society of Sculptors, the Society of Women Artists and Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

During the lecture Hazel Reeves would like to make the event as lively and interactive as possible and welcomes questions, which can be supplied to her in advance.
